

TRADE UNIONS FOR CUBA

Huge turnout for solidarity with Cuba at CSC Labour Party Conference fringe meeting

Cuba Solidarity Campaign (CSC) ran a successful stall at the Labour Party Conference, recruiting over 50 new members and increasing its affiliated trade union branches to the campaign. Many Labour MPs including Jeremy Corbyn, Leader of the Labour Party, John McDonnell, Shadow Chancellor, Ian Lavery, Shadow Minister for Trade Unions and Civil Society and Lillian Greenwood MP visited the stall.

The CSC fringe meeting was one of the best attended at recent Labour Party conferences, with many delegates, trade unionists and local activists in attendance. "Next year you'll need a bigger room!" a delegate said at the fringe, with the crowds overflowing into the corridor to hear from speakers including Teresita Vicente, Cuban Ambassador, Baroness Angela Smith and Tony Burke, **Unite** AGS. They spoke of the how the US blockade of Cuba continues and international solidarity with Cuba must continue. Teresita Vicente urged solidarity at this crucial time for Cuba. "Don't be fooled by the change in tactics - the goals are still the same. Let's show the imperialists that we stand together, in solidarity, against the US blockade and occupation of Guantanamo Bay", she said. "We will continue with our internationalism, sending doctors all around the world, despite the difficulties of the blockade - demonstrating that another world really is possible".

Baroness Smith celebrated the summer's Miami Five Freedom Tour and paid tribute to the crucial role of parliamentarians in inviting the Miami Five to Britain which led to the successful visa victory against the then Home Secretary, Theresa May. "The visa victory and the Freedom Tour shows how campaigning works", she said.

The All Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) on Cuba member gave an update on the blockade, where fines are continuing against companies and banks that carry out business with Cuba. "This impacts us too in Britain, including the closure of CSC's Co-operative Bank account, due to US blockade policies", she said.

Catherine West MP, Shadow Foreign Minister, was in the audience at the fringe meeting and wrote on Twitter following the meeting; "so much progress but need final lifting of blockade."

British trade unions in solidarity with Cuba

Over 80 delegates packed into a standing-room only Cuba Solidarity Campaign fringe meeting at the 2016 TUC Congress in Brighton. The fringe meeting was one of the best attended at the Congress, demonstrating the excellent international solidarity with Cuba from across the British trade union movement at this crucial time.

Delegates heard from a range of speakers on how, despite the re-establishment of diplomatic relations between the US and Cuba, the US blockade remains in place.

Christine Blower, **NUT** International Secretary, spoke of Cuba's "incredible achievements for humanity, despite the blockade. One can only imagine how much more Cuba could achieve without the huge obstacle of the blockade in place".

She gave examples of how Cuba is a world-leader on education, including spending the highest percentage of GDP in the world on education, at 13 percent, compared to the 6 percent in Britain.

Mick Whelan, **ASLEF** General Secretary, spoke of how the present situation of improving relations between the United States and Cuba is a victory for international solidarity.

"The blockade was supposed to isolate Cuba - but solidarity meant the US became isolated", he said. The **ASLEF** General Secretary spoke of US threats beyond the blockade, including Obama's intention to fund and support breakaway unions on the island. "Solidarity is needed with Cuban unions in light of this threat", he stated.

Steve Turner, **Unite** Assistant General Secretary, highlighted the recent anniversary of the USbacked coup in Allende's Chile in 1973 and drew recent parallels with US intervention in Latin America and its continuing regime change activities.

He paid tribute to the role of **Unite** and Tony Woodley in the struggle to free the Miami Five and spoke of his pride of attending May Day in Cuba. "It's impossible to not be moved by the spectacle of a million Cubans marching in unity, it makes you so proud to be there in solidarity", he said.

The **Unite** AGS gave examples of how the extraterritorial blockade impacts British trade and interests, including the \$140,000 fine of the WATG Holdings for designing a Cuban hotel and the Co-operative Bank closing the accounts of CSC due to blockade legislation.

Jorge Luis Garcia, Cuban Embassy Political Counsellor, sent Her Excellency Teresita Vicente's greetings to the TUC Congress. "Relations are a long way from being normalised", he said. "The blockade is still in place and Guantanamo Bay is still being illegally occupied. We need your continued solidarity", Garcia stressed.

Roger McKenzie, **UNISON** AGS, chaired the meeting. "I'm an organiser so after these meetings I always think, 'How can we organise to build solidarity with Cuba?' I can tell you how; go into your workplace, your communities, spread the word of Cuba's achievements despite the ongoing blockade, and affiliate your branches to CSC to help end the US blockade once and for all", he said.
